C.9.2 MODIFICATIONS, MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR

(c) For repairs of rips in the monofilm material, an adhesive patch will be used to repair the sail where the rip is less than 10 cm long. For damage covering a greater area, the whole panel may be replaced in accordance with Rule C.9.2 (b). Only one panel can be replaced.

Mainsheet Ratchet Block Attachment to Hull

Replace the existing Wichard Snaphook with a standard quick release shackle. Careful to use quick release shackles where it is impossible to lose the quick release part.



Cunningham Downhaul System / Boom Vang

A) Add to the existing Cunningham Downhaul System:

1 x extra single pulley + extra rope 40 cm length.

Cunningham downhaul rope lengthened to have a total length of 360 cm (320 cm original + 40 cm extra).

Rig the system as shown in the photo to give an extra 2 pulleys leverage on the Cunningham System.

B) The extra length of the Cunningham Line may be secured to the Mainsheet Ratchet Block Attachment to facilitate use, particularly in strong winds.



Cunningham Tension Release System

To facilitate the release of the Cunningham Tension, two solutions exist:

a) An additional « Release Line » of 60 cm may be added to the Cunningham with 2 x small shackles as per the photo, or b) No additional line is added, and the cleat on the Cunningham is simply placed on the top of the plate as per the photo.



Outhaul and Top Mainsheet Pulley

Lower the top mainsheet pulley with an extra rope, Maximum length = 20 cm.

Add 2 pulleys extra leverage on the outhaul: 1 x additional single pulley + 120 cm extra rope.

Mainsheet Ratchet Block Attachment to Hull or boom Replace the existing Wichard Snaphook with a standard quick release shackle. Careful to use quick release shackles where it is impossible to lose the quick release part. Mainsheet Ratched block attachment can be of any brand.



Cunningham Downhaul System/Boom Vang A) Add to the existing Cunningham Downhaul System: 2 x extra single pulley + extra rope 45 cm length. Cunningham downhaul rope lengthened to have a total length of 360 cm (320 cm original + 45 cm extra). Rig the system as shown in the photo to give an extra 2 pulleys leverage on the Cunningham system.

B) the extra legth of the Cunningham Line may be secured to the Mainsheet Ratchet Block Attachment to facilitate use, particularly in strong winds.

C) Splicing is allowed



Cunningham Tension Release System

To facilitate the release of the Cunningham Tension, two solutions exist:

a) An additional "Release Line" of 60 cm may be added to the Cunningham with 1 x single pulley + small shackle as per photo. b) No additional line is added, and the cleat on the Cunningham is simply placed on the top of the plate as per

the photo.



Outhaul and Top Mainsheet Pulley Lower the top mainsheet pulley with an extra rope, Maximum lenght = 20 cm-

Add 2 pulleys extra leverage on the outhaul: 2 x additional single pulleys + 120 cm extra rope.

Article 9.2 Constitution Act: proposal of modify of number of EC members (Extraordinary)



9.2 The EC shall consist from 3 to 9 members, the number of members is decided by General

Assembly. The EC is elected at the General Assembly, one members is indicated by Bic Sport. The election of the President will take place in a separate session before the others members of the EC and will be done as secret ballot. The EC will expire after 4 years on the 31st of December of the fourth year, it will remain on duty until the new EC will be nominated by the GA . A member of EC will be declared dismissed in a GA with at least 75% of votes of members having rights vote. The President shall appoint/revoke from the elected members:

- 9.2.1 One Vice President
- 9.2.2 The Secretary
- 9.2.3 The Treasurer
- 9.2.4 Appointment or task to EC members
- 9.3 The President and an appointed Vice President (in case of vacation of the President) have the legal representative of the OBCA.
- 9.4 The decisions of the EC will be taken by simple majority. In the event of a tied vote the President will have the casting vote.
- 9.5 The EC can appoint a sub-committee to accomplish particular tasks. The EC can also dissolve this same sub-committee. A sub-committee works under the authority of the EC or of a member(s) of the EC delegate for that.

Admission procedures 2019

Requirements to be member of the OBCA (and maintain the status of recognized NCA by OBCN):

- Being 'not for profit' association, formally constituted in compliance with law of the country of origin
- 2. The name of the association shall be the "Name of the Country" National O'pen Bic Class Association' and "Name of the Country" NCA, or equivelant in local language, or the name in both English and local language

(example: German National O'pen Bic Class Association and German NCA)

Having as its mission:

- To administer the National O'pen Bic Class Association (NCA) in accordance with WS and National Sailing Federation requirements and to maintain the class rules.
- To promote and develop the NCA in the Country according to OBCA requirements
- To support and defend the interests of NCA sailors in the country
- To promote a high standard of sailing and racing, whilst upholding fair and sportsmanlike conduct both on and off the water
- To keep the "fun" in sailing and retain the unique philosophy of the OBCA
- 3. Having at least 10 competitor members and 2 club members active in the country
- 4. Establishing an Executive Committee with at least 3 members
- 5. Having paid the annual subscription fee, by the 30 of June of the year
- 6. Having submitted the request to the Secretary of the Class
- 7. Having a web site with the list of members publish (name, family Name, year of birth, country, club, number of member) linked to the OpenBic class web site

NCA Fees 2019 (same 2018)

- BASIC Fixed NCA Fee 300€
- •Additional Variable NCA Fee based on number of members on the 31 December 2018
 - ➤ Up to 50 2018 members 50€
 - ➤ Up to 100 members
 75€
 - ➤ Up to 101 or more members 100€
- ➤ To be paid by the 30th April 2019 on OBCA Bank Account

Example: an NCA with 89 members on the 31 of December 2018 has to pay for Subscrition NCA Fees 2019 300€ Fixed + 75€ Variable= 375€



Others Class Fees

- •Eurochallenge, 3 days, 80€ (late fees 90€), including a dinner, 20% retain fee for the Class
- •WOC or EOC, 5/6 days 180€ (late fees 200€), including a dinner, 40% retain fees for the Class



Bic Sport Suppor for 2019

- Supplying 50 Charter Boat for EOC 2019 (or even a few more if necessary);
- Supplying of 60 Charter Boat for WOC 2019 (or even a few more if necessary);
- Delivering of lycra for the EOC and WOC;
- Awards from 1st to 5th place for the 2 categories U13, U17, the 1st female, 1st, 2nd and 3rd with 5 medals for the winning teams;
- Contributing € 3.500€ per year for the operating cost of the Class.


